High Street speeding - hope at last?

Residents' complaints about speeding traffic on our High Street have fallen on deaf ears for years because, we were told, there were "not enough deaths" to warrant any action and that "average" speeds were little over 30mph.

As we all know, traffic moves quite slowly during the day. The problem is mainly at night but the police analysis of the data didn't show this up.

However, we recently obtained some raw data from the council's speed measuring devices and analysed it for ourselves (see graph on page 3). The data clearly shows that at night a great deal of traffic is driving illegally at over 30mph.

And lorries make up a lot of that night-time traffic. HGVs thunder past the small cottages on the High Street, separated by only a narrow pavement. Residents cannot sleep and the vibration is causing some of the buildings to develop significant cracks.

Despite years of requests and petitions, neither the police nor the council would/could do anything about the situation. It seemed pointless to keep asking for enforcement of the 30mph limit: nothing was going to happen.

Instead we turned our attention to the physical layout of the High Street. Teddington High Street is straighter than ours but it is hard to drive along it too fast because of central bollards, in-line bus stops, pedestrian refuges and parking spaces that effectively create "bends" in the road. With support from Cllr Pat Parsons we've been asking the Council to consider a similar approach in Hampton Wick, making it hard for vehicles to break the speed limit whether or not there are signs or police present.

Act now to keep Bushy Park free!

The HWA played an active part in last summer's campaign against the proposed car parking charges in Bushy Park.

We believe that Bushy Park should be free for everyone who wants to use it. There *may* be a case for charging a toll on through traffic which only uses the Park as a short-cut. But parking charges penalise people who want to stop and enjoy the park.

Last summer the parks agency assured MP Vince Cable that the matter would be debated in Parliament before a final decision was made. However, we have now learned that Minister Margaret Hodge can, and probably will, simply sign it through without any Parliamentary debate despite the overwhelming opposition from all local MPs, all local councils and the vast majority of local residents and park users. 

High Street Hope?

At last it seems we might be getting somewhere! Chris Smith, head of the Council's transport policy unit, believes that our approach might be achievable without having to find any new money. Funding is already available to improve the accessibility of the High Street bus stops. Some of our suggestions fall within the remit of the scheme e.g. a central pedestrian refuge will prevent dangerous driving and will help people cross the road near a bus stop. As our proposals are all low cost and virtually zero maintenance Chris hopes to include some of them and effectively kill two birds with one, low cost, stone.

We had a very encouraging site-meeting with Chris and his colleague Mick Potter. It appears we can achieve a great deal without losing parking spaces. The detailed scheme will be published for consultation soon. If the final plan reflects our discussions, we will be delighted to support it.

More Good News

We have also learned that under a London-wide lorry ban, heavy goods vehicles (HGVs) over a weight of 18 tonnes are banned from driving through Hampton Wick during the following hours:

Monday - Friday: 9pm - 7am (including 9pm Friday night to 7am Saturday) 1pm Saturday - 7am Monday

Deplorable Neglect Of Our Library

On 10th November Carol Dukes and Mark Buckley from the HWA met with CIIr Pat Parsons, council ward champion Yvonne Kelleher and

representatives from the council's Libraries, Parks and Highways departments. We walked around the library to try to agree what actions would be taken to improve health and safety, planting and signage.

There is total confusion within the council over which department is responsible for which of the paths (including Shaw's Path), roadways and flower beds in the area. It is likely that the paperwork was botched when the land was transferred to council ownership. We hope that our ward champion, Yvonne Kelleher, will be able to get the situation clarified.

Yvonne backed the HWA's previous requests and again asked the council's construction services to take <u>urgent</u> action to repair or replace the crumbling steps and collapsing handrails which make the area positively dangerous, particularly because it is so poorly lit (and often not lit at all) after dark. Nothing has yet been done.

The street lighting around the library is poor to non-existent. However, despite the fact that the path is used as a public thoroughfare, the highways department are refusing to light it, saying that the libraries department must provide the funding. The libraries department say they don't have the money. So, yet again, nothing is being done.

On June 19th, at a meeting with the HWA, Ian Dodds the head of the council's libraries department admitted that the lack of signage to the library, and on the library itself, was a serious problem and agreed to get something done about it. The meeting on 10th

November came to the same conclusion. But nothing has been done.

On August 18th, at a meeting with the HWA, a representative of the council's Parks department (Kevin Waggott) promised that shrubs would be planted, at least in the beds actually adjacent to the Library, and that this would happen during the autumn. We are now in late December and nothing has been done.



The HWA deplores the council's negligence of Hampton Wick's one and only public amenity. Last April, Cllr Liz Jaeger, LBRuT's cabinet member for youth, culture and leisure, said "We understand the importance of libraries to local people and have committed £1.4m to the financial investment in building refurbishment and service improvement over the past five years."

Well, Cllr Jaeger, we certainly haven't seen any of it in Hampton Wick!

St John's Update

I met recently with the parish vicar, Revd David Lund and two churchwardens to discuss St John's Church which has now been closed for a year. Revd Lund explained that the matter is not in his hands and that the church authorities have given him no information on the church's future.

The Bishop of Kensington has told us that the future of St John's would be determined by the diocese and the parish. However the parish (the vicar and his churchwardens) are being left out of the loop. This leaves only the diocese. Next stop - in January - the Archdeacon! I'll report back.

In the meantime, the churchwardens reassured me that basic maintenance, e.g. clearing of gutters, is still being carried out on the church building.


It was a deeply moving occasion on which everyone came together to share our sadness and pride.


