



The Sherriff of Hampton Wick

Robert Cedric Sherriff was born at the family home (2 Seymour Road, then called "Rossendale") in 1896. Leaving Kingston Grammar School in 1914 he followed his father into an insurance office. In the Great War he served as a captain in the East Surrey Regiment – gaining a Military Cross, and severe wounds, at leper (Ypres).

A dozen years later, to raise funds for Kingston Rowing Club, he wrote a play based on his experience in the trenches. "Journey's End" opened at the Apollo Theatre, starring a very young Laurence Oliver, before transferring to the West End. It was to become acclaimed worldwide as one of the best testimonies to the horrors of the Western Front ever written.

Here and in Hollywood he wrote the scripts for films which remain classics, including "Goodbye, Mr Chips" and "The Dam Busters". He later moved to "Rosebriars" in Esher Park Avenue. He died at Norbiton in 1975.
